# **Push Button Start**

OK, my cruise control didn't work when I bought my car so I ripped it out. I decided to use the steering wheel controls as a push button starter. All I hafta do is turn my ignition on, and hold both buttons in at the same time.

### 2 button start:

Here is how it was wired using 2 SPDT relays. SPDT means Single Pole Double Throw. It basically means the relay has one output that can have 2 different signals.

I Mounted my relays right behind my fuse box, that way they are hidden, but still easy to get to. And that way you don't need to run allot of wires

#### Relay #1

85 - Cut green and red wire coming from controls on steering wheel and attach to signal side.

86 - Ground.

87 - Cut green and black wire coming from controls on steering wheel and attach to signal side.

87a - Not used.

30 - To terminal 85 on relay # 2.

#### Relay # 2

85 - To terminal 30 in relay #1.

86 - Ground

87 - 12v ignition (preferably 10 gauge wire ran directly to ignition harness).

87a - Not used

30 - Cut starter wire in ignition harness and connect to starter side.

You do not hafta cut the starter wire, I did to have like a starter kill, if somebody gets in my car they are not gonna be able to figure out how to start it.

## One button start:

For anybody who wants to try this setup with only one SPDT relay, here is how to wire it.

85 - Green and black OR green and red wire coming down from the steering wheel controls, cut and connect to signal side.

86 - Ground.

87 - 12 volt ignition (preferably 10 gauge wire ran directly to ignition wire running to ignition).

87a - Not used.

30 - Cut the starter wire and connect to starter side.

I wasn't sure if anybody was gonna try this, so I figured I'd post it with either one or two relays. Let me know if anybody is using this, I wanna see how many people relay like the push button set up.

If you wanna wire one up without using your cruise controls just go buy a momentary switch. If you don't know, a momentary switch springs back to its original position when you let it go. Then wire one side of the switch to a 12 ignition source and the other side to terminal 85 using the single relay wiring set up. Then when you hit the switch, the car should fire up
